Movement disorders are neurological conditions that affect the speed, fluency, quality and ease of an individual's movement. A clinical example of a movement disorder characterized by abnormally decreased motor function or mobility (bradykinesia) is Parkinson's disease.

Newcastle Upon Tyne, UK. The defining feature of parkinsonism is bradykinesia, or slowness with decrement and degradation of repetitive movements ("fatigue"). Subtle "bradykinesia" has been reported to occur in the "normal elderly" population, but this may reflect a non-specific slowness rather than bradykinesia as defined above. Parkinson's disease is the most common neurodegenerative cause of parkinsonism.

Parkinson disease is a slowly progressive degenerative disorder of specific areas of the brain. It is characterized by tremor when muscles are at rest (resting tremor), increased muscle tone (stiffness, or rigidity), slowness of voluntary movements, and difficulty maintaining balance (postural instability).
