Shay Logging Locomotive At Cass

The Cass rail-logging era (1901-1960) involved 17 Shays - including up to 12 simultaneously, and a rather short-lived Climax. The first locomotive - Class 40-2 Shay, No. 1(first 1) - arrived and entered service in late December 1900. The most notable Cass Shay was No. 12, a Class 150-3 engine.

Cass Roster - Locomotives

Shay #2: This locomotive (Class PC-13) was built in July of 1928 by the Lima Locomotive Works (Pacific Coast Shay) for the Mayo Lumber Company of Paldi, Vancouver Island, British Columbia. It later worked for Lake Logging Company, Cowichan Lake British Columbia & Western Forest Industries, and at Honeymoon Bay, B.C. before its acquisition by Cass Scenic Railroad in the 1970s.

Cass Scenic Railroad, Home Of The Unique Shay Locomotive

The oldest operational Shay is located at the Cass Scenic Railroad State Park in West Virginia as their locomotive No. 5. It was first bought in 1905 by the West Virginia Pulp & Paper Co. at Cass. Number 5 is in fact still running on its original rail since it first ran in 1905.

The huge logging operation used Shay locomotives almost exclusively. From the first at 50 tons, locomotive sizes increased with almost every purchase. By 1905, two 80 ton Shays were in use for the steep Cass Hill, the climb out of town up the mountain.

The combined innovations of the Shay locomotive, band saws, and log skidders meant that the Cass mill could produce up to 125,000 board feet of lumber a day. Unfortunately this also meant that the red spruce forests were being depleted faster than they were being restored and by the 1930s many of West Virginia's red spruce forests were completely gone.
